



Lavendon Neighbourhood Plan Referendum Information Statement

A Referendum relating to the making of the Lavendon Neighbourhood Plan will be held on Thursday 23rd January 2020.

The question which will be asked in the Referendum is:

'Do you want Milton Keynes Council to use the Neighbourhood Plan for Lavendon to help it decide planning applications in the neighbourhood area?'

The Referendum area is the same as the area which has been designated as the Lavendon Neighbourhood Plan area which covers the whole of the Lavendon Council's parish area. A map of the referendum area is attached to this Information Statement.

A person is entitled to vote in the Referendum if on 23rd January 2020:

- he or she is entitled to vote in an election of any Councillor of Milton Keynes Council whose area is in the Referendum area; and
- his or her qualifying address for the election is in the Referendum area.

A person's qualifying address is, in relation to a person registered in the register of electors, the address in respect of which he or she is entitled to be so registered.

The Referendum expenses limit that will apply in relation to the Referendum is £2,422.35.

The Referendum will be conducted in accordance with procedures which are similar to those used at local government elections.
