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

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Yvonne is a textile artist from Milton Keynes who likes to work in layers, adding colour, print, machine- and hand-embroidery to a fabric base.


She exhibits framed pieces at Westbury Arts Centre and other galleries, but Yvonne also enjoys making smaller items.

Ralph MGAULIFFE

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

Her inspirations include Rembrandt, Lauren Child, Vermeer, James Jean, Drew Struzan and Shaun Tan.


"My focus is on portraiture and illustration, and I enjoy working on a wide range of commissioned projects, working from life or photography."

"Art is an endless pursuit. I never stop learning, I hope I keep improving, and that I never stop loving it."







David MIWING

"I have participated in exhibitions across the UK and have had work in a number of private exhibitions."




Csaba Tibor PALUTAS


